

BOARD MEMBER AUTHORITY

The Board member as an individual has no official power since only the action of the Board as a whole is recognized by law and accepted practice. This indicates that policies for operation of the school system must come from the whole Board of Education through its deliberations and actions in formal Board meetings.

Each individual Board member should represent, open-mindedly, the entire school district, and in consequence let his considerations for the entire district take precedence over every form of partisanship and special interest.
